Military Fort and Military Psychiatrist Remote Viewed
this part is the written continuation after an audio first part

This follows directly after the end of the audio where I remote viewed to a U.S. military Fort talking to an officer who works with recruit psychology.

We are only here, because they say to us that they are coming for you in an ambulance, so we've got to find out if you are ok. - he

I am just fine Sir! I am looking forward to meeting with the aliens, and with you too of course. Would you authorize this? What "Fort" are you in? - me

Oh god, we get those heavy snows down in the winter! So won't you *not* come here in the wintertime? *And, sometimes*, we do play that Christmas music to them in the winter. - he, he thinks that sometimes they play Christmas music to the recruits in the "canteen" when it is Christmas times, it is his assessment on how that positively affects their psychology and mental performance

We don't want you to see them, in their medical tanks. *But that is what happens around here.* - he with image of a Reticulan type alien lying in a small tub that has a fluid in it

I will remote view for the name of this base at the sign that is at the entrance to the base. I see again the golden colored inscriptions on the sign. The sign is a gray concrete or stone rectangular slab and the text is engraved so that the letters sink into the stone and the letters have then been painted with a gold yellow. There is quite a lot of text there, and more than one line of text.

"This place is a school", I hear from somebody. "This is where we get out the retards. *And weed them out from the rest.* So this is *that kind of school.* The fucking retards don't come back. So! See ya later. The fucking retards go, bye bye! This is that kind of school here. And they can't come back even if they cry. *Because we don't hire, or employ, women!* Those fucking retards. *And it's my job to kick them out!* Officer Bryant was my name once. But I guess now I've gotta change it.", the man says, but I saw a man with the "high and tight" haircut which I haven't seen that my Officer Agent Bryant would have had. "change it" meant to change his name. I see a guy with a nose bleed doing push ups on the ground there outdoors, and the drill sergeant with the hat with a wide flat brim is standing with one foot down on his back while he is doing it. It is also past the lunch meal time and he is not getting to go have his meal because he has not finished with doing his push ups. "That's how we train them.", someone says, all of these are not said by the psychologist at the office. "This is Officer Bryant's place. *So we don't want these fucking retards here! Go crawl in the mud!*", I hear from the "high and tight" haircut man.

We don't want you to be worried about them. - calmly smiles to me the officer doctor, thinking bright white lights of a UFO shining in the sky

I am not worried about aliens. They are my friends. - me

Santa can go down into chimneys, but I do not. And, when children they become scared of me, I tell them I am Santa. And then they become happy again! And, my nose, sniffs at them. - Hamish
Hello Hamish, I love you. - me

My military guys have good shoes here. - psychologist seems to be the one who said
But sometimes they just can't walk or run further. *And it is my job, to figure out what is going on in their head.* When they just sit down there, on the ground, and they say they can't go any further, and they want to quit it. Mostly it is the swimming part of their training that gets them. And then we gotta call home to their moms. Or take them down to a hospital. *Sometimes their minds crack over here.* And then we've gotta figure out a medicine for them. Oh well! That is at least all in a day's work! General Patton doesn't want me to talk to you anymore about the military. *So let's just leave that at that.* - psychologist
Oh, General Patton! - psychologist then shouts out for Patton to hear

The military wants to give them more medicines, but we can't. *Not until we get them pregnant first.* So we've gotta use you for that! - Patton to me, "them more medicines" means medicines for the recruits there at the Fort

What is the name of this Fort? - me

What? Were you really listening? - someone says

I was spying on it with remote viewing. - me, the psychologist thinks about reaching to his polished bottle of bright amber colored liquor but maybe he doesn't

I want to remote view the sign again to read what it says on there.

Interesting. I don't see a lot of individual personal cars coming in and out of here with the recruits coming to or leaving the base. I see white buses with recruits who are going all at once, and they have got the short haircuts the "high and tight", being driven to remote sites for more training with areas that have hills in the terrain.

So. You really do not want to call this place Fort Patterson? - General Patton asks me, as if he were knowing that I am remote viewing to try to read the main entrance sign

What is it called then? - me

We are connected with the Fort Patterson. *Because, we send some of our recruits to there.* - GP

And, it really happens quite seldomly that we do not want to send them there. - psychologist about sending recruits from their Fort to the Fort Patterson or how he means it

Let me go back to seeing the recruits over at the barracks.

Some of them get scared of having a gunshot at their head. *And we've got to deal with that physical, and trauma.* We deal with that here, really well. We tell them how to go on. - psychologist about recruits who get psychological damages from having a gun pointed to their head

They don't like swimming or diving here, they are not with the Navy. So we gotta help them with that too. I am with the Fort Bragg unit. We make our "Navy men" enlisted here. *But we don't have Frogmen.*

We never did. We don't have a diving team unit. - psychologist

And we really do send them home for Christmas! Oh boy! The Christmas time really is the best time for our boys! And then they go home and eat their turkey dinner! And come back home here feeling a lot

better! *And then I get a lot less suicide reports. At least for a while then.* Yeah. Yep! Christmas times are the least suicide rates! Cause our boys get to go home. Home for their moms and turkey dinners. Yep, yep! And going home for our boys, that is really their best times! I can see it in their faces, in their eyes and in their smiles! - psychologist

So. We've gotta get less suicides here, somehow. Some of these boys don't wanna go home either. So they stay here, and hang around, also even during Christmas times. *And then I've gotta keep a close eye on them.* Yep! That is what is going on here at Fort Bragg! - psych

What?! Was she really listening? - psych to someone else

God damn! We've now got to write a military report! - someone there

Sir? I am feeling just fine. And I would really like to meet with my aliens, and with you military guys. - me, although I was not too sure about meeting with the military guys I felt some resistance in me, but the aliens I want to meet for sure!

So, you know that the Clinton administration didn't really know about this? - psych

About what? - me

About what goes on here with you and me. *But that is when we signed you up. During those Clinton administration years.* Did you know that, Hon? Did you know that, Honey Dear? About those times, then? - psych

What did you sign me up for. - me

About, psychiatric medicine studies. *That we are really wanting to do with or on our boys instead.* But we've got to try it on other civilians too. Just to see how it works. To see how it reacts on you. So? Do you really know how much money we are getting on you? Do you have an interest in that, in our money? Do you want to know about Patton then? And about psychiatric medicine? That we are researching on you? And, to see how it works, then? Because, *we are really trying to reduce the suicide rates here. And seeing how that works with you, you see.* So? Do you want to know about our medicine team? Huh? And about what we do, here? - psych

We are not really doing military mind control. But some team units are here to see you. Do you want to know about our psych team? And how we send some of our guys home without it? Home, like not even during their Christmas? - psych

Ok, stop talking! It is too much talk! I wanna know what base this is! I got the name "Fort"! - me

Are you really talking to Langdon? - GP

Is that Langdon? - me to GP

Are you Carlisle? - me to the psychiatrist

Like I said, it would be odd if I had first Assistant Langdon Carlisle and now a second, new military psychiatrist on the team, and it would make more sense if this one was Langdon Carlisle too.

Going back to remote viewing the sign.

This base is located in a remote location. That is why the recruits are brought here on a white bus many of them together.

This is not the Navy. And I do not feel that it is the Air Force. It would be like an Army training site. Unless this is a basic training site which would be common for everybody. When he thought about the

Frogmen and such, he meant in his thought images that none of the recruits there use diving oxygen tanks or such, and that it is not a Navy training. So this would be Army? I looked earlier and the Army has many places called "Fort" in the United States, I found a whole complete list. So if I knew that this was the Army then this Fort would be on that list!

When I go to the entrance to read the sign, again I see a white bus that is transporting the recruits out from the base going to the left if I am standing and looking facing into the base at the entrance.

There is a Golden Standard here, and that is that we do not talk to you about our guys. - the psychologist to me about the recruits at the Fort

But do you really want to listen to us? - psych

Then come on, go and talk to General Patton. - psych or General Patton

A lot of them get kicked out of here. And then they get back here crying and screaming. Wanting us to let them back again. - again I sense the guy like earlier who said that it was his job to kick them out when they do not meet the requirements

Is this, Basic Training? - I ask that guy

What training is this, on what level? And is this the Army? - me

Hello! It is me! And I am wearing the spacesuit. - Lasarus my Zeta in a white spacesuit

Hello Lasarus. I hope to see you soon. That would make me very happy. Thank you! - me to Lasarus

Tiik, Tiik! About my back. - Hamish

You wanted to meet with us. - Lasarus to me

Yes, thank you. And then I will stop eating sugar. - me, that is the bribe with which I promised and had used today to ask to meet Lasarus in person

We wanted to go into your anus, without a ring. - Lasarus

You may, I guess. I want to meet with you anyway. - me

Do you want to meet with the Captains over there? For, they are looking at us. They were needing to see us too. - Lasarus to me about military officers

I just want to meet Lasarus first. - me

I am going back to remote viewing the sign.

We don't want to let our little ones run to you. - Lasarus about hybrid kids once I am there

I don't want them either. - me

But you are their mom! - Lasarus

No I am not. I disown them. - me

Well then this makes things complicated! - Alpha Reticular

I am trying to read the sign at the base. Can you help me? - me

First we need to go into your anus! And make sure that you do not bleed over there! - Lasarus, meaning bleed from my anus due to the procedure

I was seeing a Fort military base with a green tank at the entrance, can you tell me the name of that military Fort? - me

This is Lasarus, we are not going to tell you that. - Lasarus

Because we do not want to worry you. - Alpha Reticulan

You are also not worried about our children anymore. - Lasarus

That man over there is a Captain. - Lasarus about some military man

I do remote viewing. Instead of telling myself that "I am trying to read that sign, and it is really hard", I use another tactic, telling myself that I can see that sign very clearly, even before I do, so that I am opening up my mind into seeing it. And that is when I feel of the Fort that it is not for the Navy, it is not a Navy fort so that helps. If I can now only also exclude the Air Force, then we have got a list of Army Forts!

Ok I sense that if it were an Air Force Fort then the recruits would be jumping out of a parked aircraft that was on the ground there outside, they would have their gear on them and the jump is literally just out from the large door opening where the sliding door has been opened and they just do a little skip down onto the pavement, as the first step before they go up into the air. So an Air Force Fort would have that, so something told me to look for that to have the answer.

Army or Air Force, I ask myself... and I see the swimming pool that they have there and recruits who are scared of the diving exercise, just like the psychologist had told me about. They are nervous about going down there to retrieve an object.

Overall I keep feeling that the recruits here are inexperienced. They are new recruits. "They also have their noses broken", I hear from the man from earlier whose job it is to kick the weaker ones out. I sense that many of the recruits are not taking this training seriously, many are half motivated and somewhat uninterested, lazy, and many are tired in the mornings, so this military life is not in their body yet. Some of them were just curious to see what it would be like, and try it out, and some won't be staying. Some have the feeling that they can just go ahead and quit if they want to, after two weeks or so.

I feel like Cunningham said that he went there. It does look like the training site that I described in the Cunningham remote viewing which had the pine tree needles on the ground and the logs you had to crawl under. Cunningham supposedly then did the Green Berets training further ahead so this would mean that this is an Army Fort, since Green Berets is an Army track.

I also feel that the training here actually is pretty basic, that the recruits have not had time to build up their strength and mental skills, discipline and focus, so this is a beginners course. Not much is expected of them here really. It is intentionally easy, made to see what they are made of and to give them an easy and slow start. The real training starts further ahead, but they don't know that yet, they don't know that it is more about them being evaluated here, than about them undergoing any actual training, yet the recruits all think that they are here just to do the physical tasks and challenges, but that is not at all what they are there for. They are there for observation, not for real actual training, because if they pass this first level of inspection, then the real training starts then. For those who make it that far. And that surprises me too. Yes the recruits here think that they are training, but they are not. They are given really easy tasks.

It is not a very old base. It has not been there for a very long time, and it does not have a lot of history

like from the 1950's and that. It is just to see who wants to continue, to give the guys some time to think about it if they want to go ahead and join and be real recruits. It is to see who wants to quit on it early.

When I go into the psychiatrist's office, I see and sense guys pointing a gun to their own heads, so this office deals with the guys thinking about suicide.

I scan for, "Air Force or Army", and I find the two rows of car tires that the recruits have to skip through, this is placed on a track in the forest which is the obstacle course they run. It is more fun and games, because this doesn't get so hard for them at this point. And they also have to run and do marches wearing their big green rucksack. It is more fun at this stage, but they can really see who is prepared "and who wants it". The big guys are easily weeded out from the rest, who can all go home.

The psychologist now told me that the guys who stay at the base instead of going home to Christmas, that sometimes those guys are the ones who are really motivated who want to stay behind to train even on their free time, and sometimes they are ones who stay behind because they have no family life, and so he needs to see which they are. He really spends time to evaluate the recruits there, they are under physical and psychological evaluation here during their stay.

I look for the name of the base, I again sense that recruits are nervous and scared about the diving challenge in the pool when they have to go all the way down to the bottom of the pool. This pool is outdoors, it is not very wide but it is deeper than it is wide. They have to dive down to the bottom with their heavy rucksacks and touch the bottom of the pool.

There are no three star Generals here. - someone I'm sure Patton said, about this Fort, so no three star General works there at this low level of training site, again this suggests that General Patton would be a three star General

They all want women. *So this is where get recruits for, you know what. With what the aliens need.* - GP, so some of these recruits get abducted women pregnant for the Reticulans, I get it

The psychologist says that sometimes recruits hop on a train that passes not too far from here and that "We call them deserters.", they just quit that way.

So we do not want you to go to an insane asylum. And that is why I am here. - psychologist says, well I have been telling General Patton that I have to find him and know if he is real or I go to a mental hospital, not that I would because I have Hamish and so all is ok, but I try to paint it out as dramatic as how it really feels to me

I'll be alright. I just wanna know you exist. Hey, is there any way that I could talk to you in real life, please? That is what I need right now. - me to psychologist, but Hamish is listening and Hamish lets me see Hamish, Hamish is here for me, my very beautiful red dragon

You have told me that you are proud of me, and I am very pleased of that. *So therefore, I was here for you, Tik!* - Hamish

Thank you Hamish! I was here for you too! Always here for you. *I love you tortoise.* - me
Smack. - Hamish says the word, referring to some sort of click sound of his

We are not going to take you down to our hospital. But you gotta learn how to *breathe* properly here! - psych to me

What do you mean my breathing? - me

If you start panting. - psych

What do you mean? I won't. I will breathe normally. - me

Because, sometimes you do that. - Lasarus or psych, or psych and Lasarus was listening in on it

I want the name of that Fort, please. - me

Look, I am a military physician, and I have got to take a look at you. I am with Assistant Langdon, Carlisle. Some of these guys come in there, and they start to fight, thinking that this is a boxing match. *They think they are here to fight with each other.* So. We have got to figure this all out! - psych about recruits at the end, recruits who fight with other recruits there, and these fights is just one of the things the medical staff have to figure out how to deal with there on that base
